Tribute to Yoga Sensei, Takako Sato

After over 40 years, the yoga class at the Hollywood Japanese Cultural Institute, HJCI has come to the end as of June 2021. The last three decades of which were led by our devoted instructor Ms. Takako Sato. She was always there smiling and welcoming members, her positive attitude motivated us to improve our health and fitness. Despite having to travel a long distance to get the class each week, she showed up smiling in a good spirit, and she has never taken a fee for her class. Her practice consisted of gentle yoga and breathing exercises, which helped many of our members improve their physical ability, or to recover from injuries. I began taking my mother-in-law to the class soon after she came to live with us in 2005. At the time she was diabetic and needed an inhaler to breathe. After only a few classes, her breathing improved to the point where she no longer needed the inhaler, and never used it again for the rest of her life. Other long time members were well into their 90's, and were still very active, and enjoyed coming to the class every week. Everyone would go home feeling refreshed and happy. Thank you Ms. Takako from the bottom of our hearts for your selfless dedication to us, your energy and generosity will never be forgotten.

HOLIDAY GREEN SALAD by Susan Yamasaki

- 5-6 cups of bagged spring mix or mesclun salad greens
- 2 Fuyu persimmons, peeled and chopped
- 8 ounces grape tomatoes
- 4 ounces of cranberries or raisins
- 1/2 cup walnut or pecan pieces
- 2 ounces of crumbled goat cheese
- handful of red onion rings sliced further into quarters (optional)
- Girards champagne vinaigrette for dressing



Place all of the chilled salad greens into a large circular platter, leaving the center free for a small bowl to hold the salad dressing. Sprinkle all other ingredients on top of the green salad except walnuts and salad dressing. Place nuts on the side for those with nut allergy. Sliced almonds or shelled, roasted pistachios can be used in place of the walnuts. Chopped mango or freshly sliced oranges can be substituted for persimmons. (Do not use canned fruit.) Pomegranate arils can be used in place of cranberries. If preferring not to use champagne vinaigrette, you can use a white wine vinaigrette or apple cider vinaigrette instead. Do not mix vinaigrette with salad but allow individuals to determine how much dressing is desired. Vinaigrette will discolor the goat cheese if mixed with salad and ruin the image of a holiday wreath.
